# The SuperValu TidyTowns competition is administered by the Department of Rural and Community Development and we are here to support TidyTowns groups in their efforts to improve their area and create a sense of place.

The Department of Rural and Community Development aims to support rural and community development and to support vibrant, inclusive and sustainable communities throughout Ireland.

The Minister for Rural and Community Development provided €1 Million to TidyTowns groups to assist them prepare for the 2021 competition. Since the Department was established in 2017 over €5.2 Million has been provided directly to TidyTowns groups.

The Department supports TidyTowns groups through a range of measures and funding schemes including LEADER, CLÁR, Town and Village Renewal, Community Enhancement Programme and the Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme. As part of Project Ireland 2040, a €1 Billion Rural Regeneration and Development Fund is being administered by the Department up to 2027.

The current LEADER programme has supported over 4,400 projects totalling €178 Million, whilst the Community Enhancement Programme for 2021 provided €4.5 Million to over 2,500 groups, many of whom are TidyTowns groups.

The €5.5 Million CLÁR programme for 2021 has a specific measure to support groups develop community gardens and allotments, again a key component of the SuperValu TidyTowns competition.

Since 2016 a total of 1340 projects totalling €93.6 Million have been delivered under the Town and Village Renewal Scheme. This year alone, €7 Million has been allocated to a Streetscape Enhancement Initiative, this is a key part of Our Rural Future and is designed to make our rural towns and villages more attractive places to live, work and visit, and this strategically aligns with the Streetscape and Public Places category in the competition.

This year in collaboration with our funding partner, Fáilte Ireland, the Department allocated €14 Million through the Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme to support outdoor recreational projects. The TidyTowns unit recently prepared a new Handbook with input from the national panel of TidyTowns Adjudicators. This replaces the previous version which issued back in 2010.

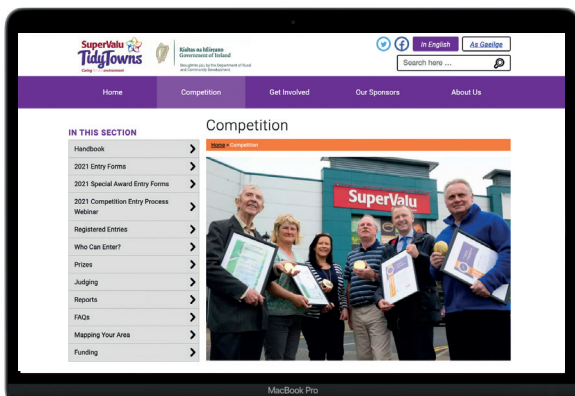

Your entry form is a super piece of work: it is well laid-out, generously illustrated and very easy to navigate. Thanks to all that played a part in putting this together. The bright colours aren't just for show, they are very helpful in the laying out of your many projects and keeping the reader on track. You've obviously gained assistance from some good photographers and the use of relevant (and appealing) photographs has never been more important than this year! Your plan is easy to navigate, well laid-out and succinct. Thank you for the account of the consultation process thereon.

We note your participation in the SuperValu-sponsored COVID-19 Community Award – staying together while apart. Well done on the numerous initiatives you list. The adjudicator is aware that behind each of these sentences is many hours, days and perhaps weeks of voluntary effort in a very changed and challenging environment. Congratulations to your group and the other organisations that no doubt also played their part. A special word here for Don – your very own Clare COVID Hero!

A core committee of 20 is a strong team and doubtless you have a strong 'bench' too as you can boast 100 volunteers behind your many initiatives. Here we see some of the organisations that assist you in your work and there's the Ennis Camera Club that might be the source of some of those photographs mentioned earlier... It's impressive to read the range of supporting organisations. This isn't limited to environmental or residential groups (although these are in there indeed) but also include groups where social inclusion and justice are core aims. Inclusivity is increasingly important in modern Ireland and we are cheered to see the involvement of our 'newer' citizens as well as older volunteers. Our congratulations to Mr Richards on his nomination but also for his great contribution to Ennis.

There must be special acknowledgement for Ennis TidyTowns efforts on social media. This adjudicator was a latecomer to the Twitter party (and is still getting to grips with it) but the work that your group has done over the last year and a bit has been nothing short of invaluable. Using this online tech, you have done not just Ennis, but the whole TidyTowns movement a great service in keeping the flag flying, encouraging others by example and inspiring others to improve. A previous adjudication report lauded Ennis TidyTowns for their willingness to share resources and know-how with other groups. Over the pandemic period you have kept to this ethos and this hasn't gone unnoticed. Your Facebook page readily gives examples of this – like your sharing of the 'hack' to reduce TidyTowns entry file size. Míle buíochas.

You kept up your local awards, an important statement sent by that, no doubt. Here, your social media savvy came in handy again. Stand-out events were your virtual but inclusive St Patrick's Day Parade, your presentations at events well outside of Clare and of course, your Mayoral Award. You've been busy!

## STREETSCAPE & PUBLIC PLACES/ SRÁID-DREACH & ÁITEANNA POIBLÍ:

Many thanks for your detailed response to the previous adjudicator's comments. Your work to address these is noted here. Those banners for the railway station look gorgeous. It is hoped that these will look just as good in place. The Lanes & Bows regeneration will have huge impact on your streetscape. The artistic rendition of this looks superb too. Redundant tree guards become vertical planters, manholes and drain covers are now works of art – really great work here in combining the aesthetic with the functional, Ennis! It's good to see the benches back and the bins slimmed. This adjudicator will admit to never having known the word Parklet before, but it's likely that these will be more common in a post-COVID world. Congratulations on maintaining your Purple Flag, an important designation for you. Wow – the new CBS looks amazing and a visit to see the completed Community College is eagerly anticipated. The new Fiddle & Bow eatery looks very inviting. We know that you'll pass on our acknowledgement of the efforts of the Shopping Centre Management and the ESB for their efforts too.



# IRELAND'S TIDIEST TOWN

## GREEN SPACES AND LANDSCAPING/SPÁSANNA GLASA AGUS TÍRDHREACHÚ:

Our congratulations to the HSE on the Best Public Building Award. The River Walk looks great, well done. You've been busy in this category too and you have a productive relationship with local authority staff that clearly works well. Our congratulations to the council staff on their efforts (e.g. at the museum, beautiful!) and on the two Green Flags for the town. It's clear that you're moving well into the realm of pollinator-friendly planting and thank you for the stats with regard to same. The Haiku Garden project looks like a very thoughtful lockdown project. This adjudicator loves the Green Road project – simple idea (though no doubt lots of effort went into this) – but very functional and of long-term benefit.

## NATURE AND BIODIVERSITY IN YOUR LOCALITY/AN DÚLRA AGUS AN BHITHÉAGSÚLACHT I DO CHEANTAR:

This is a very strong category for Ennis TidyTowns and again you've come up to your own high standards. There are probably too many projects and initiatives here to fully explore but we'll take a look at a few... The herbicide-free weed control is surely the way forward. This adjudicator has seen how effective this is. It is wondered whether there are any environmental downsides to this (e.g. carbon footprint, water use) and maybe your group could look into that. Your extensive actions for pollinators are too many to describe in full but suffice to say that you are, it is believed, leading the way in this area. More importantly perhaps, you are inspiring others to follow. The Wall-Ecology project is very cleverly done. For all their size and function, the importance of old stone walls as a habitat is so often overlooked. Your skills in communication stood you in very good stead over these last unusual months and you have harnessed both digital and traditional media in getting out the good word on urban biodiversity. Our congratulations on your 100 Trees event and recompleting your Tree Trail. A great presentation all round in this category, Ennis.

## SUSTAINABILITY – DOING MORE WITH LESS/INMHARTHANACHT – MÓRÁN AR AN MBEAGÁN:

It's worth praising yet again your efforts to share knowledge and skills and nowhere is this better exemplified than the Sustainable Development Goal factsheets. We saw these emerge on 'the socials' and they look great here too.

The Repair Café is an event close to this adjudicator's heart. Well done for sharing the know-how on this too. Your flagship projects here include your new water bottle filling station and no fewer than three projects that address the often-forgotten waste that can be generated by sporting events and even by training sessions. It is acknowledged that the sharing of reusable items isn't permitted but the other initiatives will run and run. The linkages of sustainability to sport and exercise are underlined in the Bike Week event and the Walking Bus. Our congratulations to Cornelia on her efforts. Thank you for the very detailed account of Ennis' 'Green Hospitality' offerings. This will surely be an increasingly relevant determinant in our 'staycations' in the future. We acknowledge here the great efforts of the businesses in this regard. We also salute the work of your many Green Schools. We know that some of these projects had to take a back-seat during the pandemic but we know that you're all green through to the core and we look forward to the inspiring projects that you are no doubt cooking up as we speak. Well done to Clare County Council for making new road surfacing from old. We'll keep an eye on TikTok for motivation from the Ennis direction.

## TIDINESS AND LITTER CONTROL/SLACHTMHAIREACHT AGUS RIALÚ BRUSCAIR:

This category was eagerly anticipated by this adjudicator, your previous submissions having been so strong. Indeed, it was worth waiting for as you've some really outstanding work achieved here, including three 'Flagship' projects. We're very impressed with the Gumdrop Bins – the adjudicator admits never to have seen one. Here's hoping that discos will be back to make use of them. Thanks for the pictures of the Lockdown Litter-pick which are very poignant but positive too. Just as positive was your sharing the kit with Clarecastle TidyTowns. Yet another example of your cooperative ethos.

The River Fergus Clean-up looks so impressive and this adjudicator had seen this online over a year ago. Well done for your work in this Special Area of Conservation. The Just One Street campaign should certainly inspire residents of Ennis and maybe further afield too, judging from your participation in online workshops and Webinars. The adjudicator almost overlooked your anti dog litter actions since 2019, which includes a proximity activated notification at the Lees Road Park. Super stuff. You are still rolling out the tongue in cheek Butt campaign, very good. Your ranking in IBAL continues to improve, well done. Congratulations on the graffiti cleaning, that is no small amount of work. Neither are the Town Audits or Gutters and Eaves Assessment. You continue to bridge the gap on that well-named bridge. A great submission by Ennis in this category.

## RESIDENTIAL STREETS & HOUSING AREAS/SRÁIDEANNA CÓNAITHE & CEANTAIR TITHÍOCHTA:

You have your Annual Awards listed as a 'New Project.' Is that correct? At any rate, congratulations for keeping them going through it all. The adjudicator loves the Estate Mentoring Project and would love to hear how this works out. A people-led approach is certainly the way to go. Verdant Hill seems increasingly well-named. Your online and 'IRL' assistance to local estates is another new project for you and your communication skills are again of great value to you here. Thank you for the update on the unfinished estates register. Our best wishes to the residents of An Sean Dún. This should be the focus of a case-study for other Irish estates.

## APPROACH ROADS, STREETS & LANES/BÓITHRE ISTEACH, SRÁIDEANNA & LÁNAÍ:

Thanks one last time for providing responses to the last adjudication report. There are some tricky areas therein. The lane regeneration project – to include a 'Café Quarter' looks great. The adjudicator points out some overlap with a previous category. Ennis will be very well suited to more pedestrian areas and this is a timely initiative given our new reliance on outdoor spaces. No-one appreciates this more than your eateries and pubs and judging from the photographs, they are adapting with style. It is understandable that you will miss your cheerfully painted hoarding on the Tulla Road but Curate's Court looks very well. Well done to your stalwart volunteers on keeping the bike lanes litter-free.

## CONCLUDING REMARKS:

Although it's a shame not to see the fruits of your work 'on the ground,' especially not getting to see your populace utilise and enjoy these, we commend you on the job you have done in getting it down on paper. Truth be told, the adjudicator found several of your projects familiar as indeed these had been viewed (again remotely) on social media. Over the last year and a half, keeping an eye on Ennis initiatives from afar and seeing other groups' reactions has been a really positive and reassuring experience. Your willingness to share your know-how combined with your social-media skills has made a genuine and lasting contribution to TidyTowns nationally when it was really needed. Cometh the hour...

## SECOND ROUND ADJUDICATION:

It is always a delight to visit Ennis and walk your busy streets and cross the various bridges over the Fergus River. You progressed well in the competition and were overall winners in 2005 and won a gold medal in Entente Florale Europe in 2002 which we saw on display in the courtyard at the end of Arthur's Row.

Your application is very well presented although we suggest reducing its size by about 25% for next year. Thank you for the map of Ennis with the legend on the same page. We realise that because Ennis is such a big town, it is not possible to include everything on an A4 page, although we expect it could be done on an A3 page. You decided to use two pages and at first glance it seemed to be a good idea as you indicated access roads to the other sections. You have also used a good system of marking the project locations with the number and letter as used in the application and that worked fine. However, this trip to Ennis was very different for us because we had to travel outside the town to view several projects and in some cases, we were not successful, for example, we failed to find the Haiku Garden (3E). We made it to the fabulous John O'Sullivan Park, but no one there knew about the garden. For other places, the locations were indistinct on the map but with the assistance of Google we were able to find estates such as Gallows Hill. So, it became very clear to us that there are two different parts of Ennis, the town centre and the suburbs. Thank you for the effort to assist us in getting around, but we suggest that you put all of Ennis on one map next year and also include a town centre map separately. We would suggest you review the maintenance of the directional signs. Given that Ennis is a large urban centre there can be a difficulty maintaining a litter free area but we commend you on your efforts.

# IRELAND'S TIDIEST TOWN

The town centre was looking well, and we noted the scaffolding surrounding the statue of Daniel O'Connell, for structural repair and refurbishment works which we note from Google started on the 28 June and will last for three months. Upgrades to several streets are ongoing and no doubt the flagship project improvements will be much appreciated when the pandemic ends. We look forward to the planned improvements at the bus and rail station being implemented for 2022. We found the painted manholes to be a very clever way of converting functional elements to artworks. The war memorial is a lovely tribute and fits well in the open space, surrounded by willow trees. However, it is somewhat hidden, and we suggest some appropriate pruning of low branches to give it a little more exposure.

The new building at the CBS and Ennis Community College is very attractive. We also observed hundreds of students crossing New Road to have their short break in Tim Smythe Park, which we note achieved a Green Flag, congratulations. We were surprised not to see any wildflowers in the park, but we admired the trees. Whilst in the vicinity we visited the statue of Éamon de Valera in front of Ennis Courthouse. The statue and the immediate surrounds are well maintained. However, the planting needs attention. Some shrubs have been allowed grow too tall and only the sides within arms reach are being clipped with the result they are becoming too tall and in a short while they will hide the lovely neoclassical style Ennis Courthouse which dates from the time of the Famine. Of even more importance is the proliferation of sycamore tree seedlings that are everywhere, at the base of the circular wall, coming through the middle of shrubs. If these are not removed, they will grow into a sycamore forest and conceal both the monument and the courthouse and in the process, the roots will undermine the walls. The Maid of Erin statue which commemorates the Manchester Martyrs is an important symbol of Ennis that dominates the skyline. The base is solid paving which looks cold compared with the other roundabouts which are managed for wildlife. Has any consideration been given to removing the paving and encouraging wildflowers here; they would soften the appearance of the junction and never compete with the sculpture. We had a good walk around this junction, viewed the sluice gates and the restored river walk and admired the hurling sculpture. There is wonderful history in this area which makes the historical trail very interesting. The hurling statue which highlights the sport that means so much to Clare was done in 1995. It is a nice feature, but everything changes as it ages. Whilst the statue is fine, it is somewhat hidden by the low branches of trees so we suggest you seek arboricultural advice with regard to removing some

low branches of the lime trees that would let light onto the site and especially to the information sign that is very hidden. That would be preferable to the lovely hanging baskets which are very high quality but are unnecessary at this wooded location beside the river. Across the road the mill wheel and the bilingual signs provide much information of interest, but some signs are faded. There is also an established tree here that has two stakes and ties; both should be removed before they cause damage to the tree stem. The wildlife on the river, especially the bank of swans was very appealing.

Elsewhere, we admired wildflowers in the no mow areas and the pollinator friendly planting at several locations in and around Ennis. They are of high quality. The interesting community garden beside Tierney's shop is almost hidden because of parked cars. Kincora Park has a fine tall timber sculpture on the open space surrounded by wildflowers and tall trees which gives an indication of when the estate was built. At Gallows Hill there is another large timber sculpture entitled 'The Offering'. It is very nice but the actual offering, a plant container held on top of the sculpture is not maintained and therefore should be changed for some object that doesn't need maintenance. The birch trees at the back of the sculpture are very attractive with their white stems. Less attractive are the purple leaved maple trees in front because they hide the sculpture.

We discovered the stone monument with information on Muhammed Ali's great grandfather Abe Grady on the open space at Turnpike Road. That was news for us. The roundabout planting is well done, and the open space is well planted.

As stated earlier it is always a delight to visit Ennis and having reviewed all of the material provided and being given the opportunity to walk your streets and lanes, I fully concur with the comments given by the first Adjudicator. You are to be commended for your willingness to share information with other groups which will no doubt benefit the competition going forward. Congratulations to all involved on your excellent entry.
